Abstract	The increasing complexity and connectedness of contemporary reality have generated wicked
	problems (such as extreme poverty, climate change, environmental degradation, health crises)
	that defy the research and cannot be handled through a lineal approach.
	The concept of health as a fundamental human right, not merely the absence of disease or
	infirmity but a state of complete physical, mental and social happiness (Declaration of Alma-
	Ata, WHO 1978) has been challenged by the recent pandemic impact, that has increased the
	general perception of vulnerability, and emphasized the systemic link between the planet's and
	people's wellbeing.
	The urban scenario, characterized by the massive abandonment of postindustrial assets, a
	multiethnic urban dimension and the progressive ageing of the population, still plays a crucial
	role for the quality of life, as demonstrated through its inclusion by the UN member countries
	among the key players of the Sustainable Development Goals

	Through an active role of design as a "transversal discipline" with a strong ethical base, the
	proposal aims to explore care as a female knowledge based on complexity, flexibility,
	management of the unexpected, sense of responsibility, extracting this paradigm from the

	to investigate its eco-systemic potentials as a transition strategy to healthier and more
	sustainable cities.
